LVP EXPENSES AND INCOME

LVP Commission pays for a lake warden to assist in management of Beaver Lake and Lake View Park. This position is responsible for mowing, permit issues, enforcement of rules and regulations, and safety of residents and guests at the lake.

Beaver Lake dam and structures are 87 years old and require ongoing maintenance to keep the lake in good, permitted condition under state regulations. Maintenance requirements and the need for capital improvements will accelerate as the dam continues to age. In addition, maintenance of the lake involves periodic sediment removal (dredging), which will be a recurring cost. The cost of the dredging operation which is needed now is estimated to run \$500,00 - \$750,000.
